We welcome and accept applications from new candidates as well as from the current role's holder, as long as the eligibility criteria are met. If you decide you would like to proceed in applying for the position, please complete this [online application form](#). They will then be contacted directly to provide further information. Once your application has been submitted, HQ will arrange an interview with two trustees and all approved applicant(s) will be put forward for the election process to begin.
